On the 21 September 2019 we organised a study trip for residents on St Raph's Estate.

Stop 01: Colville Estate, undergoing complete redevelopment. Here we got to see two empty shared ownership flats, and were invited into two social rented homes where we also got to speak to the residents living there.

Stop 02: Kings Crescent Estate, undergoing infill development. We weren't able to visit any flats here but one of the residents who have lived on the estate for 47 years joined us for lunch and a walkaround the finished phase.

24 residents attended the study trip. 19 people filled out the feedback form. Not everyone answered all questions.



"It is absolutely essential to get involved."



## 7. How likely are you to recommend your neighbours to come on a similar study trip if one is organised?




