- 3.16 onwards: the statistics shown on page state that 8.2% (!) of adults have no qualifications; and 57% of adults do not exercise; and 38% of children are obese.

Yet, none of the 'challenges' cited address these severe issues.

3.28) There is no evidence to suggest that 'Improvements are needed for the provision of football pitches and tennis courts.' These are very narrow sports and will not tackle the fact that 57% of Brent residents do not exercise.

Brent has previously established that there is not enough provision for swimming. The previous ('current') policy stipulated building a swimming pool in Kingsbury but this never happened. The demand for swimming and other broader sports has not changed.

Brent needs to consider sports facilities that attract a broad uptake if it wants to solve the prevailing issues it faces.
