Originally from the US, Bethe Bronson lives and works in London. As mixed media artist, her work references concepts frequently associated with photography such as presence, absence, and hidden moments in time.

During the first UK lockdown she fixed a handmade pinhole camera outside her window. The aim was to capture what the eye alone cannot perceive and attempt to document this strange experience of being "locked down". A series of 24-hour exposures, these images reveal the trail of the sun as it moves across the sky. The resulting time-lapse video documents the passage of days, weeks, months, as the sun makes its way across the sky as it has always done, as if nothing has changed.

## 26 - Lynn Dennison

On her daily walks on Hampstead Heath during the first lockdown, Lynn Dennison noticed a renewed interest from people in engaging with the natural world. She began documenting the different ways people move through landscape in this time of social distancing; some on bikes, some running, some with families, most alone, many wearing face masks. The resulting work documents 30 days of isolation through these daily walks. Lynn documented six locations on my walk in 30 seconds of footage each day. She then collaged the footage together, forming alternative arrangements of the landscape. This work not only documents an unprecedented time in our lives through our activities in the landscape, but also the change in the landscape itself.

# 22 - Magdalena Gluszak-Holeksa

Magdalena Gluszak-Holeksa (b.1990 in Poland) is a visual artist interested in ideas of identity and perception that are influenced by inherited memories and the subconscious. Her paintings and drawings evoke transitory moments within spaces that merge elements of landscape, body parts and manmade structures, where the boundary between the familiar but distant past and ever-becoming present is in constant flux. To navigate alongside and in-between subconscious and conscious thoughts is like carrying around objects with weight, volume and temperature. These works, created during self—isolation in the midst of the pandemic, explore this uncertainty as a state of mind by questioning conventional ways of knowing and perceiving that influence how we approach mental health, faith and belief systems.

Marc Fresko is a Brent-based artist who produces kiln-fired glass in his home studio under the name OccasionallyBeautiful. This piece explores the idea of finding a balance between nature and human development – trees, bushes and flowers with beautiful blue skies on one side, contrasted with densely packed buildings with polluted skies and soil on the other. Accordingly it is titled "Re:store? The Balance Between Nature and Development". The piece was produced by hand-cutting 150 pieces of art glass and fusing them together at 804°C – it consists of glass only – no paints, enamels, glues or anything else.

This artwork is created during the pandemic as an artist's response to online art workshops. The book of 20 folds (11m) was created as a metaphorical reflection on the substance of online relationships. Art is inside a black archival box as an envelope of events surrounding our contemporaneity. Ink marks are applied on one side, mirrored on another by the press. The body of the book (Amazon packaging) is torn, crinkled, and creased.
